

## **Shelley Reed Memorial Scholarship**

Shelley Reed, of Wayne, Maine, was passionate about the education of all children. She was a teacher and school counselor before she became an Education Specialist at the Maine Department of Education where she focused on the areas of truancy, dropout prevention, alternative education, school counseling, homeless education, and expelled and suspended youth. She also served as liaison to the military, and worked with the Maine Afterschool Network and Juvenile Justice Advisory Group. She was actively engaged in the Maine Charter School movement and served as President of the Maine Alliance of Public Charter Schools, an experience that cemented her belief that all children can achieve. She served as Co-Chair of the Governor's Task Force to Engage All Students convened during Governor Baldacci's term to address the needs of disengaged students aged 16-24.

Shelley served for more than ten years as a Board Member of Syntiro, a nonprofit organization located in Augusta (previously Readfield).

In honor of Shelley's memory, the Syntiro Board of Directors has established the **Shelley Reed Memorial Scholarship**. This \$1,000 annual scholarship will be awarded to a youth in foster care who aspires to continue their education beyond high school. The award will be announced in late May each year and awarded on behalf of the student to the institute of higher education at which the student is enrolled the fall immediately following graduation from high school.

All Maine 12th graders who are in foster care during at least part of their senior year in high school are eligible to apply.

The application must be submitted no later than April 1 each year. The application, essay, and two letters of recommendation (from a teacher, school counselor, JMG specialist, case manager, employer, foster parent, etc.) should be emailed to Syntiro (office@syntiro.org) with "Shelley Reed Scholarship Application" in the subject line.
