A number of Syntiro employees testified at the “Diploma” bill hearing last month and we submitted written comments to the Maine Department of Education on the impact of the new law on students, teachers and schools. In particular we were concerned about access to a diploma/graduation pathway for students with disabilities and the ability of schools, especially poor rural schools like GEAR UP schools, to meet the requirements of proficiency based education. We are pleased to report that the Department of Education has announced it is “withdrawing the current proposed rule around proficiency-based diplomas and will start a new rulemaking process for a substantially different proposal based on the feedback it received from the field.”
